Chairman's Report

Free Flight

Radio Control

This year has been particularly quiet in terms of competition flying with none of our regular F3A (aerobatics) pilots competing during the season, either due to other commitments or events being cancelled due to poor weather. In Fun-Fly Martin and Mike Bell (both Hartlepool RMC) took part in the BMFA Nationals with Martin placing 3rd in Class 1 and Mike 7th in Class 2.

Control Line

Competition wise, 2023 has been yet another successful year for Control line in the North East. We have one British champion in Steve White from the Novo's, this achievement is extra special as it is the 3rd time in a row that Steve has been champion. At the nationals the Novo's combat team came home with 5 trophies' out of the 15 available, which again is fantastic considering the size of the club. No champions in combat however, so maybe they need to try harder next year! In the Vintage combat league, the Novo's were placed 2nd, 6th, 7th, and 15th. The competition season however was hampered by bad weather and a total of 7 competitions were cancelled due to this.

Locally, Albemarle is continued to be used for sport and competition flying. There were 2 vintage league competitions booked, however one of them was unfortunately included in one of the 7 mentioned earlier. Albemarle was also used for F2D team practise on a few occasions as well which were well attended.

Looking forward to 2024, we already have two vintage league competitions booked at Albemarle, and hopefully there will be some more f2D training days. The control line nationals are back to a weekend at the end of August, so will hopefully attract a few more entries.

Indoor

No changes have been reported with Peterlee RMC and Washington MFC continuing to run regular indoor sessions. Full details of indoor events are on the area website www.northeast.bmfa.uk

Chairman's AGM Report 2023

Area Meetings.

I'm pleased that the area continues to be well supported by the clubs.

With the creation of the Scottish area, we lost a fair percentage of our clubs and membership, I hope that the BMFA will continue to support us to the same financial levels as previous.

Albemarle

Has been well used this year, averaging a booking per month. Weather has not been overly kind but many of the bookings have gone ahead regardless.

Only 2 clubs have booked the base for flying, Novocastrians and Peterlee. I would encourage other clubs to use the facility. It costs the area £800 for the license and at approx. £70 per use.

Events and Competitions

Only 2 clubs have asked for support for events; Novocastrian for 2 X Centralised Vintage combat events and Eden Valley for a glider Tow event. We have been happy to support these events but would encourage other clubs to have a go. I have been asked if we can do the same again for next year for the Vintage Combat centralised events.

Reminder if anyone would like to run area competitions, we have the Brian Park Memorial and Indoor trophies available.

Beamish Museum

After a successful demonstration and encouraging meeting Beamish Museum did come back with a date for the control line flying. Unfortunately, it clashed with a F2B and a vintage combat centralised event, so I had to decline. Hopefully next year may bring some success in this area.

BMFA NE Area Secretary's Report 2023.

2023 has been another quiet year for me as Area Secretary, the bulk of my work has been in preparation and distribution of Area minutes and the application for the licence to use Albemarle Barracks, as well as keeping the Area Website events page up to date. The one major change has been the loss of half of the affiliated clubs following the creation of a new

BMFA Area to represent clubs in Scotland, this involved me in a number of meetings in my other role as Achievement Scheme Coordinator to assist in setting up the Achievements Scheme in the new area.

The North East Area now has a total of 33 Affiliated clubs (as opposed to 66 in 2022) with 754 members, unfortunately I can't provide a detailed breakdown of the numbers as the information is not readily available via the membership portal.

Attendance levels at Area meeting remains steady, although we could always do with a few more clubs being represented. To this end there is now a bulk email facility on the Area website which allows us to contact all members in the Area and I intend to make use of this to try and generate more interest in attending meetings. The Areas Council also have some ideas in the pipeline to boost attendance at area meetings as there are much larger areas that fail to get the level of support that we enjoy.

In closing I would like to thank the elected officers and delegates for their support over the last year and look forward to working with them again if re-elected.

Achievement Scheme Coordinators Report 2023

This year the bulk of my work has been helping my opposite number in the new BMFA Scotland area get the scheme up and running, with me providing suggestions for Area Chief Examiner candidates and guidance on how tests should be conducted. To assist with this, I have been invited to attend two training and testing days in my dual roles as ASC and ACE, however poor weather forecasts for the chosen dates mean neither has taken place. Closer to home the Area planned to run a training and testing day at Albemarle Barracks, however the first attempt was cancelled due to a lack of potential candidates, the day was rearranged for later in the season in the hope that giving candidates more time to prepare would boost numbers. Unfortunately, this had the opposite effect with even less support for the second attempt, so this too was cancelled. Discussions with the Area Chief Examiners and potential candidates gave some potential reasons why the event was so poorly supported. The main one being that candidates felt uncomfortable taking the tests away from the familiar surroundings of their club sites. To this end I, along with the ACEs are planning to run some

training and testing sessions on club sites next season, all we need are clubs to invite us along. So, if your club is interested in hosting an event, please let me know. Finally with two of our ACEs standing down this year we are looking to replace them; I have a couple of people in mind who meet the requirements to take up the role and will be putting their names forward for consideration at the next area meeting.

Area Chief Examiners' Reports 2023

I have contacted all our current Area Chief Examiners to request their annual reports and for confirmation of their willingness to continue for another year. Unfortunately, this year two of our current ACE's have decided to stand down. Mike Swales has decided to step down for personal reasons whilst Jim Edwards is still suffering from "Long COVID" and has decided it's time for some new blood. Bob Wasson has been by far the busiest of the examiners although he reports that things have been noticeably quieter this year, primarily due to the success his club (Darlington & District MFC) have had in promoting the achievement scheme over the last few years. This has resulted in 100% of their flying members having passed the BMFA RCC test. Jim Edwards, Mike Swales and Brian Johnson reported very little activity with only some coaching and a couple of failed tests between them. As for myself I have done a fair bit of coaching within the clubs I'm in and have had one successful "A" and "B" test as well as helping a couple of members pass the RCC test. With the creation of the new BMFA Scotland Area I have been invited to attend a couple of training and testing sessions to assist their new examiners get to grips with how tests should be conducted, however the weather has intervened and neither event has taken place, whether they will still want my help next year remains to be seen.
